THE CHANGING FACE OF BILLERICAY. Anyone who has lived in Billericay during the past two years will have noticed many changes; New shops, houses pulled down an electric train service, new housing estates. It would be a very sorrowful day if all our trees were lost or some new development sprung up unchecked, if we lost our scenic country. The Billericay Group of the Council for the Presevation of Rural England (C.P.R.E.) see that change is guided, old relics preserved, trees replaced and planted and the countryside kept free of left litter and that developing of the countryside is kept under control. It advises the Local Council on matters concerning the countryside and generally makes its point .

In Billericay the C.P.R.E. has about 250 members (handouts about the C.P.R.E. from the Editor) and always welcomes new ones. The C.P.R.E. was formed nationally in 1927 and in Biller-

icay in 1937.

The C.P.R.E. is a very important organisation nfor withou it one wonders what our countruside would now be like.

Change is bound and has got to come and the C.P.R.E.

does not oppose it but guides it.

Let us take a look at Billericay and the change in the last few years. In the High Street has been the greatest centre of change, Hurlocks is now nought but dust, No 3, Chapel Street has been restored, a new War Memorial has been erected in which the C.P.R.E. took no small part there are many changes too numerous to mention. In the enrivons large new estates have sprung up.

I have one or two things to say which I think would be

good suggestions for the guiding of change in Billericay;
(a) Owners of houses on the new estates should be encouraged to replace the hundreds of chesnut flences without a break which are one of the worst things on a Estate with hedges trees (preferably coniferous), or at least flowers and climbing plants trailing up the fence or a few trees.
